Acts of Kindness: Supporting Typhoon-Affected Barangays Through Gift-Giving

On December 20, 2024, the Isabela State University (ISU) Cauayan Campus conducted the outreach initiative titled *Acts of Kindness: Supporting Typhoon-Affected Barangays Through Gift-Giving.* Held in Brgy. Gagabutan and Brgy. Items included clothing, toys, and household essentials, thoughtfully prepared to address the specific needs of the affected communities. Interactive activities were also organized to uplift the spirits of children and senior citizens. The event's success was made possible through the collaborative efforts of ISU faculty, staff, students, and stakeholders. Preparations included resource mobilization, with donations collected from various colleges, and coordination with barangay officials to address logistical needs. The Php121,350 budget, funded by ISU Cauayan's Extension and Training Services (ETS), covered snacks, gift packs, and transportation expenses.

The outreach initiative successfully fulfilled its objectives of delivering meaningful support, strengthening community resilience, and igniting hope during the holiday season. Beneficiaries conveyed heartfelt gratitude for the assistance and encouragement they received, which brought much-needed relief and joy to their lives.
