The Regional GAD Research and Learning Center, in partnership with the Gender Resource Research and Development Center, University Library, and the Future Information and Library Executives Society (FILES), hosted the first Library and Information Science (LISTEN) Seminar-Workshop on June 13, 2024, at De Venecia Building, ISU Echague.

This event aimed to encourage inclusivity and gender equality in librarianship. It focused on using gender-fair language and promoting gender awareness within the university, based on policies like CMO 01, s. 2015. The event, themed "Library Seminar: Integrating External Policies, AI Tools, and Best Practices in Maintaining Integrity," gathered 100 participants, including librarians, administrators from universities and colleges, and government agencies.

The seminar aimed to develop an AI education policy for higher education by exploring the impact and perceptions of text-generating AI technologies. Several key topics were discussed, including the application of Turnitin for detecting AI usage in academic work. Mr. Joven D. Donga-as highlighted challenges educators face with plagiarism and the use of AI tools like ChatGPT and Canva. Mr. Carl Bryan W. Sibayan talked about the importance of having proper records

management systems in place to protect institutional documents from disasters. Meanwhile, Mr. Lauren Kipa-an, University Director for Library Services at Benguet State University, stressed the role of an Integrated Library System (ILS) in enhancing accountability and efficiency within libraries.

Adding to the event's excitement, Ms. Marilyn G. Subido was awarded Best Dressed during the fellowship night, where she wore a stunning Inabel Filipiniana dress that represented both the theme and the venue.

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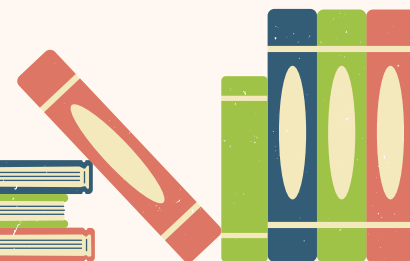
